



Childwatch & Youth Center Member Information and Guidelines

Downtown YMCA

Childwatch - ages 6 weeks through 6 years

Hours: Monday – Thursday 8:30 am -1:30 pm & 3:30 pm- 8 pm

Friday 8:30 am – 1:30 pm & 3:30 pm- 6:45 pm

Saturday 8:30 am – 12:15 pm

Youth Center – 5 years and older

Hours: Monday – Thursday 3:30 pm- 8 pm

Friday 3:30 pm- 6:45 pm

Saturday 8:30 am – 12:15 pm

Youth Center additional morning hours will ONLY be offered during D-11 Spring Break, Summer Vacation & Christmas Break ONLY 9 am – 1:30 pm

When the Childwatch or Youth Center has no children ½ hour prior to closing, the area will close early.

Childwatch & Youth Center is exclusively a member's only program. Your child must be on a household membership or youth membership to use and there is limited guest usage. See staff for guest details.

We welcome you the Downtown YMCA Childwatch & Youth Center! The purpose of this flier is to acquaint you with the policies and guidelines. Please carefully read the following information.

NO OPEN FOOD IS PERMITTED IN ANY AREA, NO EXCEPTIONS.

Due to the variety of allergies and the range of reactions children can have to allergies, NO open food will be allowed in the Childwatch or Youth Center area. Any food, to include suckers, must be eaten in the hallways prior to entering the program area. NO food will be allowed beyond the Youth/Teen Center doors for the safety of each child or family that have life threatening food allergies and choking hazards. Children with gum will be required to throw it away.

SIGN IN AND SIGN OUT PROCEDURE

No child will be admitted without the parent's valid YMCA membership card or the child's card. Only parents and grandparents may utilize the Childwatch. No nannies, babysitters, siblings, etc. No exceptions.

YMCA policy states youth 11 years and older are not required to have a parent present to use the YMCA facility, therefore youth ages 11 years and older are allowed to sign in and out of the center without parent presence and are not subject to the 2 hour rule.

In Childwatch, every parent is required to take tag #, one for the diaper bag and one to wear on the parent.

Parents are responsible to check diapered children and complete all areas of the sign in sheet. Children will not be admitted into the programs until the sign in process is complete. Parents, we ask that you DO NOT ENTER the Childwatch at any time and DO NOT have your child open the door. Staff will help as soon as they can. SAFETY FIRST!

COLORADO STATE LAW REQUIRES THAT THE PARENT MUST REMAIN INSIDE THE YMCA FACILITY WHILE HIS/HER CHILD 10 yrs and under IS IN THE CHILDWATCH & YOUTH CENTER.

Failure to remain in the building will result in suspension and / or loss of Childwatch and Youth Center privileges.

Financial Assistance:

If you are unable to pay the full cost of YMCA membership or programs, you may apply for assistance based on your financial situation. Funds for financial assistance are raised through the YMCA Partners Campaign and come from generous individuals, businesses and the local community.

WE EXPECT PARENTS TO AID IN THE COMFORT OF THE CHILD AND THE STAFF BY...

- ☞ Bringing children in with clean attire and shoes ON. Infants (non-walkers) are required to have feet covered with socks or shoes that must be put on by the parent.
- ☞ Checking your child's diaper **AT** the Childwatch counter to be sure the child has a clean diaper. Change diapers in the hallway bathroom or locker room if needed. Only staff is permitted in the Childwatch. Stations are located in each bathroom as well as girls and boys locker rooms. Parents are not permitted in Childwatch.
- ☞ Ensuring the child is well fed or nursed **BEFORE** signed in. Bottles and cups are ok.
- ☞ Providing **PLASTIC** bottles, sippie cups, spare diapers, baby wipes and clean diaper bag. We cannot change diapers on children 3 years and older, cloth diapers or if wipes are not provided.
- ☞ Clearly labeling all bottles, or cups. Cups, bottles not labeled **BY THE PARENT** ARE NOT served to the child. Drinks are allowed but no food of any kind.
- ☞ Being sensitive to other children by not bringing in sick or unusually fussy children into Childwatch.
- ☞ Remain in the building in the area you designated on the sign in sheet. Please notify Childwatch if you are going to be in a different area than you have designated. If this policy is not followed your membership is subject to suspension and/or termination.

YOU CAN EXPECT THE STAFF TO...

- ☞ Work with you to help your child feel secure and welcome in our facility.
- ☞ Provide a positive social experience for your child.
- ☞ Provide a safe, quality supervised environment for your child.
- ☞ Every staff is current with CPR/AED and First Aid certification and participates with ongoing trainings.

LATE PICK UP POLICY

Our staff members work full and often tiring shifts, and in many cases they must go home to take care of a family too. We ask that you respect our closing time. If this policy is not followed your membership is subject to suspension and/or termination. Please note the 2 hour maximum time limit per day which is strictly enforced.

ILLNESS AND DISEASE

DO NOT BRING A SICK CHILD TO THE YMCA CHILDWATCH where infection may be spread to others. This includes unusual fatigue, coughing, sneezing, runny nose and eyes, fever, vomiting, diarrhea, and sore throat regardless of the cause. THE CHILDWATCH STAFF RESERVE THE RIGHT TO REFUSE A CHILD THAT APPEARS ILL.

CRYING OR UPSET CHILDREN

For the comfort and best interest of your child and others, it is our policy to come get you if your child cries for more than 10 consecutive minutes. Although this policy may interfere with your personal workout needs, our goal is to provide a positive experience for all the children.

DISCIPLINE

Discipline at the YMCA is based on an understanding of the child's individual needs and stage of development. Our goal is to develop self-discipline, responsibility for self, and respect for others. It is used on the use of positive reinforcement, reasonable expectations, logical consequences, distraction and diversion, and, if necessary, supervised removal from the group for short periods of time. Physical punishment is *never* administered.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURE

If an emergency should occur that requires the YMCA to evacuate, staff will escort all children outside through the Bijou exit doors and across to the First Presbyterian lobby where you may meet your child. In the event of an injury or accident involving your child, appropriate first aid measures will be taken immediately by staff and you will be paged to the Childwatch.

BATHROOM POLICY

Children who are being potty trained will be directed to the bathroom. Staff will not accompany children into the bathroom and they may not assist with bathroom functions or changing clothes. Children in diapers 3 years and older must be changed by the parent. If a child has a bowel movement while in our care and diapers AND wipes are not provided by the parent, we will immediately retrieve the parent to change the child for their comfort and well being. Parents are not permitted access or allowed to accompany their child to the Childwatch bathrooms but are welcome to utilize the hallway or locker bathrooms if they need to accompany their child.
